THE TEN HIGH GROWTH SECTORES: ECONOMY, JOBS AND INFRASTRUCTURE



SPECIFIC ACTIONS WILL INCLUDE:

Three operating Special Economic Zones (SEZ) in Ekurhuleni, Tshwane and Sedibeng.

One Special Agro-Processing Zone in the West Rand. 15 revitalised industrial parks, 12 Agro-Parks and five agroprocessing facilities.

R60 billion in infrastructure spend to create 100 000 jobs and develop 50 black industrialists. Tshepo1million to create 250 000 additional jobs for the youth.

30% of Government procurement sourced in township-based businesses

Artisans will repair maintain government buildings and benefit 10 000 townshipbased firms. Upscale welfare to work programme to enable 100 000 unemployed young women

SPECIFIC ACTIONS WILL INCLUDE:

The Township Economic Bill will enable growth for small businesses, operating in townships and CBDs.

Rezone taxi ranks and turn them into retail and commercial hubs. Gauteng Growth and Development Agency (GGDA) to increase exports to the continent by 15%, and 10% to BRICS countries by 2025. By 2030, intra-Africa trade should create 150 000 jobs.

SPECIFIC ACTIONS WILL INCLUDE:

Investments in bulk water infrastructure , water mix, smart technologies the capture of groundwater, re-use of wastewater and treatment for acid mine drainage and water harvesting.

The Gauteng City Region Observatory to unveil the water security plan in May 2020. Increase energy generation through renewable energy. Recommissioning mothballed power stations, increasing the availability of gas, deploying fuel cell, battery storage technologies in smart grids in new cities, and rolling out waste-toenergy and solar farms.

SPECIFIC ACTIONS WILL INCLUDE:

Facilitating ease of movement for goods ,services and people


> **Investment in public transport infrastructure – logistical hubs, intermodal facilities, rolling stock, buses and taxis.**

18 major arterial roads will be rehabilitated, upgraded and constructed to (SEZs), new economic nodes

SPECIFIC ACTIONS WILL INCLUDE

Over the next five years:

- 4 billion per annum in buying goods and services from 2000 township enterprises
- Infrastructure programme to support 50 black industrialist
- Supporting 50 emerging black farmers and 20 black agro-processors
- Supporting 500 cooperatives in the care economy
- Creation of 250 000 sustainable and decent jobs



SPECIFIC ACTIONS WILL INCLUDE:

Building the silicon valley of Africa

The integration of the innovation hub, network of eKasi labs, Tshimilogong precinct, Universities and research institutes high tech SEZ

Free highspeed internet connectivity in all townships.

Partnerships with ICT companies to provide affordable broadband to every household in Gauteng.

Digital economy skills and link private sector innovation and skills academies with our public education system. 100% of government services on digital platforms.



As the government delivers on the priority actions relating to GGT2030, we will see:

- eKasiLabs established in locations across each of the five corridors expansion of the services offered at the nine existing eKasiLabs
- improved connectivity across the GCR 80% of the population to access the internet by 2024
- Prioritising last mile connectivity
- Driving inclusive economic growth to benefit SMMEs, cooperatives, township businesses, youth, women and persons with disabilities)
- Improved access to funding ,grants and access to market.
- Expansion of the Welfare-to-Work programme to benefit 100,000 unemployed young women to self sustainability.

An inclusive economy through targeted investment will be delivered, comprising:

- Intensified Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) and Gross Domestic Investment (GDI), with the 2019 to 2024 (MTSF) target set at R50 billion.
- Investment encouraged in sectors with significant employment potential:
 - Automotive
 - Capital equipment and rolling stock manufacturing
 - Agro-processing, food and beverages
 - Business Process Outsourcing/Services (BPO/BPS) and ICT
 - Finance and retail
 - Tourism and hospitality
 - Creative and cultural industries
 - Logistics and warehousing
 - The green economy
- Establish Gauteng as a hub of the 4IR, centre of digital economy, home of AI, crypto currency and big data

As government delivers on the priority actions relating to agriculture, agroprocessing and associated infrastructure, we will see:

- Continued support for farmers across the various agricultural value chains, with a focus on the grain value chain (Sedibeng and West Rand), the horticultural value chain (all corridors), the poultry value chain, the piggery value chain (West Rand, Sedibeng and Tshwane) and the red meat value chain (all corridors).
- The completion of 12 fully functional agro-parks and five agro-processing facilities in township hubs.
- SMMEs supported through the provision of various agriculture value chain facilities: maize milling facilities (Lesedi, Emfuleni and West Rand), vegetable packhouses (all corridors), red meat abattoirs (Tshwane and Ekurhuleni) and abattoirs for poultry processing (distributed across all corridors).

As government delivers on the priority actions relating to infrastructure, we will see:

- By 2025, we will spend R60 billion on building and maintaining infrastructure contributing to the creation of an additional 100 000 jobs.
- By 2030, R1.3 trillion would have been invested in key infrastructure programmes addressing the GCR's growing socio-economic demands in the following key sectors:
 - Water, energy, regional sanitation, freight and logistics associated with the Aerotropolis, integrated public transport, egovernment, modern social infrastructure, education, health and ECD infrastructure, transformative economic infrastructure within township areas.
- Improved coordination and integration of all modes of public transport, with affordable, reliable, safe public transport and improved public transport hubs linking residential, business and industrial centres, for improved access for all.



- Completion of a new freeway (the PWV15), construction of a new transport services centre, design and delivery of a BRT between Ekurhuleni and Johannesburg, expansion of the Gautrain Rail Network, and delivery of intelligent transport systems that improve service delivery and allow for real-time communication and access to information on transport safety, traffic flows, incidents, fault reporting and other specifics.
- Through a partnership process with the taxi industry, municipalities and province, taxi rank facilities in all townships and Central Business Districts (CBDs) will be transformed into vibrant economic hubs, with shared ownership between operators, business, the youth and women.

- By 2025, the GCR will have three fully operating SEZs in Ekurhuleni, Tshwane and Sedibeng and one special Agroprocessing zone in the West Rand, plus 15 revitalised industrial parks, 12 Agri-parks, and five Agro-processing across the five corridors.
- This will be a single industrial ecosystem that supports the ten high-growth and township SMMEs.
- By 2030, our province will have the biggest inland logistics hub and dry port in Africa – the Transnet Tambo-Springs Logistics Gateway. This will give us a major competitive advantage in the continent.
