Urban Water Scarcity and Municipal Finance:

A Case Study of Johannesburg

Residents and businesses in Johannesburg are faced with inadequate water supply. South Africa's municipal revenue model relies largely on the resale of water and electricity to generate revenue to fund municipal operations. However, municipalities have discretionary power to prioritise spending, often leading to inadequate investment in infrastructure maintenance. This study discusses the institutional and fiscal dimensions of the water crisis in Johannesburg, exploring how persistent neglect of infrastructure maintenance has contributed to avoidable water losses. By examining the interplay of governance arrangements and budget dynamics, it describes some root causes of the ongoing water challenges.
